- Location:** 7070 Winchester Circle, Boulder Colorado 80301
- Check-in Procedure:** On the first day, please plan to meet for breakfast at the Coriolis Cafe here at Micro Motion. We will meet in the lobby of our offices at 8:00 a.m. and go to the cafeteria for breakfast. For the remaining days, class begins at 8:00 a.m. and typically ends around 3:30 p.m.

- Airport Distance:** Denver International Airport is approximately 43 miles from Boulder. If you are not renting a car, we recommend using the **Boulder Super Shuttle** service (**303-444-0808**). In light of current events, please plan enough time to get to your flight on time. Normally, we recommend allowing a minimum of two hours from the end of class to the time your flight departs. For directions, see attached map.

What's there to do when you're in Longmont - Boulder?

Road Trips:

(To check road conditions within two hours of Denver, **dial 303/639-1111**; for conditions throughout Colorado, dial 303/639-1234.) Online the web address is: www.cotrip.org.

A drive up Flagstaff Mountain overlooking Boulder will give you great views of Boulder, Denver and the mountains. Simply head west on Baseline Road. You'll pass Chautauqua Park on your way up. Along the way are places to pull off and enjoy the view and Flagstaff Summit Park is at the top. If you go over the summit, don't miss Gross Reservoir.

Just beyond the city of Estes Park lies Rocky Mountain National Park. Keep your eyes open for bighorn sheep, elk and deer. Black bears and mountain lions also inhabit the area, although they are rarely seen. A drive over Trail ridge Road (only open in summer) is always worthwhile. You could spend the entire day at the park or continue to Grand Lake, Granby and Shadow Mountain Lakes, where you will find many activities both in summer and winter. (In winter months you must get to Grand Lake over Berthoud Pass.) In Estes Park you will find the Stanley Hotel, which was featured in Stephen King's book, [The Shining](#). On Main Street you can watch candy makers and browse through a variety of shops.

Mt. Evans, just outside of Idaho Springs, is a great drive in the summer. It's the highest paved road in the continental United States. On the way to the summit you can see elk and bighorn sheep grazing, snowfields and unusual, almost petrified trees. The view at the summit is unforgettable.

Skiing:

Skiing is a very popular activity in Colorado. There is world class skiing less than two hours away in places like Vail and Winter Park. Eldora Mountain Resort is located about 30 minutes from downtown Boulder and has cross-country, snowboarding and downhill skiing available. Gambling:

Feeling lucky? If gambling is your game, head for the casinos in the mountain communities of Central City and Blackhawk. The drive will take about one hour and fifteen minutes.

Other things to do:

Bike, walk or rollerblade down Boulder Creek Path. Do the "Mall Crawl" -- take a stroll down Pearl Street Mall -- it has a variety of bars, restaurants and shops to browse in. It's also a great place to "people watch" and see some local entertainers.

Boulder has tons of coffee shops! The Trident Cafe is a great espresso bar for coffee and tea. The Boulder Bookstore has a nice coffee shop -- buy a book and then start reading it over some cappuccino!

Take a walk through the University of Colorado campus.

Chautauqua Park is a great place to hike, picnic or dine.

Explore "the Hill" area above the University of Colorado. This college hangout offers eccentric shops, bars and restaurants.

Driving directions

You may take 470 northbound, just after exiting the airport (see map), and follow it northwesterly 18.5 miles to I-25. User without a transponder can still pass through toll plazas without stopping. Instead a photo of the license plate will be taken and a bill for the toll mailed to the vehicle owner. No account is required. E-470 does not accept cash anywhere for tolls. ExpressToll and license plate bill-by-mail are your only options.

Travel north on I-25 roughly 8 miles to Hwy. 52. Travel west on Hwy 52 roughly 11 miles to 71st Street. Turn left on 71st Street, right on Winchester Circle, and into Micro Motion as above. We recommend this route.

On January 1, 2013 E-470 implemented its latest toll increase. Plaza A became \$2.35/\$2.95

Driving directions:

- 1. Take Peña Blvd. to I-70 westbound.**
- 2. Take the I-270 exit to Ft. Collins.**
- 3. At the I-76 and I-25 interchanges, do not take any exits. I-270 becomes US36.**
- 4. Entering Boulder, take the first exit and veer left to the Foothills Pkwy.**
- 5. In North Boulder, the Foothills Pkwy, becomes Diagonal Highway (US Hwy. 119). Continue after the traffic light at 63rd Street, the next intersection is Hwy 52. (IBM is to your left.) Turn right on Hwy 52 and travel east for about one block.**
- 6. Turn right on 71st Street.**
- 7. The first street you reach is Winchester Circle. A large sign says Gunbarrel Technology Center.**

Turn right on Winchester Circle. Micro Motion is located in the center of Winchester Circle. Visitor parking is available in front of the building.
